# From the Pastor's Desk...

March 2025

Right now, as I compose this letter, we are experiencing a warming trend in our weather. The sun is out, the breeze is cool, and the snow is melting. Mother nature is giving us a false sense of security in our weather patterns. We live in Michigan where anything can, and usually does, happen. Enjoy, my friends while it lasts.

Much like our weather, the church also has trends and Peace is no different. As we look to the beginning of Lent (Ash Wednesday is March 5th at St. John's Episcopal Church beginning at 7:00pm. I'd like to see all of you there!) our trend seems to be heading toward a decreased attendance on Sunday mornings. All of us have things to do, people to see, and just want to "stay at home." Even your Pastor has those days! But we cannot afford to allow it to happen.



I have had a lot of time to reflect on patterns, comments, suggestions, and yes, even negative comments about the Sunday morning worship service. Your Worship and Music team does a phenomenal job of making changes, etc. to keep our worship services more meaningful overall. I can count on one hand in the last four years how many individuals have commented on my messages, good or bad. We have a dedicated music team who gather each week to practice and prepare for Sunday worship. We participate in the meal every week. We gather as family to give thanks for the blessings of our lives, yet there is something missing. Our "tree of life" is shedding its leaves!

Much of today's discussion about church trends today indicate the missing component is people, and not programs and ministries. Experts agree churches are missing the blending of faith, trust, commitment, and spirituality, and the fulfillment of baptismal covenants. There's no getting away from it; church attendance across the board is on a dramatic decline. Peace is no different. Just this month we filed our annual report which shows our "confirmed" membership in our congregation is 119, and the average attendance in 2024 for in-person worship attendance is a mere 47. That's a difference of 72 members who aren't attending worship in our sanctuary. And I will state once again: *All of us have things to do, people to see, and just want to "stay at home."* Even your Pastor has those days! But we cannot afford to allow it to happen.

Personally, I wish I had an answer, but I don't. What I know is our door is always open; and the gate swings freely as we are ready to welcome all. Maybe some of you have ideas and suggestions and comments as to how we can turn this trend around within our congregation. If you do, please let one of our council members know, or feel free to speak with me. I would love to hear from you.

## 2025 OUTREACH EVENTS OF PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH

The following is a list of Outreach Projects and Events that Peace sponsors each year. These one-time projects have a time commitment of about 1-6 hours including meetings. The list is impressive and Peace is proud to hold these events, but members' time and contributions are essential to continue. The Community Action Team is asking members to prayerfully consider helping with one or more of these events. We thank you for supporting these projects and look forward to your continued participation in the future.

- 1. <u>BLESSING BAGS FOR HELPING HANDS:</u> Items are collected by the congregation, such as hair brush/combs, hand sanitizer, tooth brushes and toothpaste etc. and are given to Helping Hands to distribute to the homeless and needy. Contact Jim Bradley. This project is held as items are needed.
- 2. <u>HELP FOR THE HOMELESS:</u> In cooperation with ELCA-NWLM Synod Capital Conference, Peace is collecting hats, gloves, blankets, hand warmers, etc. during the months of January and February and again in May and June. The items will be given to Housing Services of Mid-Michigan for distribution.
- 3. <u>LOADS OF LOVE:</u> In cooperation with Quality Dairy, we will be offering free laundry, 3-4 times this year. Four to six volunteers are needed per event. Contact person Joe Crigier. First event is Feb. 15; 2<sup>nd</sup> event is June 21<sup>st</sup>; the third has not been scheduled at this time.
- 4. **PROJECT SUCCESS:** A collection of food items is organized to support students in the alternative education program at Charlotte High School when they are on breaks. Contact person Cathey Levi. Collections as needed.
- 5. **EARTH DAY:** Earth day will be celebrated this year on Sunday April 27<sup>th</sup>.
- 6. <u>COMPASSION SUNDAY</u>: A chance to financially support a child in need. To be held, Sunday May 4<sup>th</sup>. Contact person Barb Myckowiak.
- 7. **FAIR TRADE:** By purchasing Coffee, Chocolate and Olive oil from the display in the gathering area, we are supporting farmers in 3<sup>rd</sup> world countries to get a fair price for their products. Contact person Barb Myckowiak. This is a year round event.
- 8. <u>HELPING HANDS PANTRY:</u> Each month different items are collected and donated to Helping Hands. Check the bulletin board in the gathering area for the item for the month. Contact person Jim Bradley. Ongoing.

- 9. <u>CHURCH PICNIC:</u> A potluck picnic after service. Another chance to have fellowship. Contact?. **Summer**
- 10. <u>BACKPACKS FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN:</u> Collection of school supplies/backpacks for area students in need. Contact person Louise Bradley July/August
- 11. GOD'S WORK OUR HANDS: A Loads of Love project to be scheduled for September or October. Contact person Joe Crigier
- 12. <u>CROP WALK:</u> Walk and/or sponsor a walker to raise funds for world hunger. Contact person Stacy Leiby. October 5<sup>th</sup>.
- 13. **TRICK OR TRUNK:** Halloween celebration with decorated stations in the church and candy distribution. Contact person Karen Jorgensen. October 31.
- 14. <u>THANKSGIVING DINNER:</u> Preparing a traditional Thanksgiving dinner for anyone in the community at the Eaton Senior Center. Preparation times on Wednesday and dinner served on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 27<sup>th</sup>. Contact person Amy Hoesli.
